## **Timeline for Election Changes**

The change to single-member district elections will begin in 2022 and occur as individual seats come up for election thereafter. Incumbent board members will serve out the remainder of their term for which they were elected or appointed. Those members will then have the option of running in the district where they currently live.

New District Election Schedule (Based on the map shown on page 3)

November 2022 - District 3 (Coincides with Place 1 Election Schedule) and District 5 (Coincides with Place 5 Election Schedule)

November 2024 - District 1 (Coincides with Place 2 Election Schedule) and District 2 (Coincides with Place 3 Election Schedule)

November 2026 - District 4 (Coincides with Place 4 Election Schedule)


One thing that did not change is the election process for Place 5. Pursuant to state lawunique to Jefferson County, Place 5 is currently elected from all areas of Jefferson County that do not lie within the geographic boundaries of the Jefferson County School district – that is - areas that lie within cities having a municipal school system. Place 5 was unaffected by the voting changes.

Anyone interested in seeking election to the school board from District 3 or District 5 must live in the district. The date for candidates to qualify is January 28, 2022. Those interested in running for of uary 28es the e2
